

REMEMBERING NMC IN YOUR WILL

Remembering NMC with a gift in your will is a special way to preserve new music for future generations. After providing for your loved ones, a gift of any size would make a real difference to our support for composers.

What is a will?

A will is an important legal document which lets you decide what happens to your money, property and possessions after your death.

What type of gift can I leave to NMC in my will?

After providing for your family and loved ones first, there are three types of gifts (called a 'legacy') you could consider leaving to NMC:

- A residuary legacy where you donate a specified percentage of your estate.
- A pecuniary legacy, which is a gift of a fixed amount of money.
- A specific legacy, which is a gift of a specific item or object.

How do I write a will?

We strongly recommend you seek appropriate legal advice from a solicitor when writing your will, to ensure it is drafted according to your wishes.

What information do I need to include?

To make sure we receive your gift you'll need to include our name, address and registered charity number:

I already have a will, can I update it to include a gift to NMC?

Yes! Your solicitor can help you create a codicil, which is an official alteration to your will. There is no limit on how many codicils you can add to your will.

Who can leave a gift to NMC in their will?

Anyone can leave a gift to NMC in their will, and you do not have to be wealthy to do so.

Leaving even a small percentage (called a residuary legacy) to us in your will goes a long way. People often find they can afford to be more generous in a will than in their lifetime.

No matter the size or amount, your gift will contribute to our work with composers and make a real difference to securing our future.

How will my gift be used?

If you have a particular project close to your heart, then you are more than welcome to indicate that you wish your gift to be used in that way.

However, we would encourage you to consider leaving a gift which remains unrestricted, so that funds can be directed wherever they are most needed at the time.

Do I need to let NMC know that it is included in my will?

It is entirely your choice whether you wish to inform us of any provision made to NMC in your will. We would of course be delighted to hear from you if you have done so, in order to thank you and keep you informed of our plans.
